

City Commission meeting - November 23, 1987 - City Hall - 7:00 p.m.

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Mayor Gilley, with Comm. Smith and Barrow in attendance.

AGENDA

1. Minutes of the previous meeting

Mayor Gilley ask the commission if they had had time to review these minutes. With no additions or correcitons to same, Comm. Smith presented a motion to accept them as written, seconded by Comm. Barrow. Roll call and vote - Smith yes, Gilley yes, Barrow yes.

2. Treasurer's report

Mayor Gilley called for discussion of this report. There was none to be heard. Comm. Barrow presented a motion to accept it as printed, seconded by Comm. Smith. Roll call and vote - Smith yes, Gilley yes, Barrow yes.

3. Discussion - salary for future commissioners

Mayor Gilley said he felt this was now becoming necessary to get anyone interested in being on the comm1ssion. The filing fee was now \$20.00 and no one wanted to pay that for a non-paying job. All of the commission was in agreement. They agreed to have the first reading of Ordinance #87-6 220.92 creating a salary for commission members, Tues. 11/24/87 @ 9:00 a.m.

4. Other

a. Mayor Gilley ask Mr. Euguen Waller if he wanted to address the commission. He said he was in attendance on behalf of the several elderly residence who reside by him. He said the decision the commission had made at the Oct. meeting not to allow the trash vehicles on the alleys between the months of Dec. thru March was really causing a hardship for these people because they can't take the trash our on Main St. Plus the fact that if they could there would be the risk of accidents occuring when three different companies tried to stop and collect the trash on Main St. Jay McGuffey ask if there was any way of eliminating having so many different

companies in the city to pick up the trash. Mayor Gilley said the idea of a franchise had been brought up once before when Currie Milliken was mayor and it created a lot of confusion. But he felt it was a problem the commission should deal with in the near future. He then ask the clerk to notify the three companies who pick up trash in the city that the commission had decided to rescind their decision regarding their using the alleys during the winter months. She agreed to do so.

b. Fence at the cemetery

Mayor Gilley ask David Stiffey to inform the commission what this was about. David said that Pete Jones had been so good about bush hogging and different things around the cemetery, he just thought the fence should be put back up as soon as possible. Mayor Gilley noted in the absence of Comm. Crisp, who is the cemetery commissioner, it might be a good idea to let him handle this.

c. Metro drafting-committee

Mayor Gilley said Judge Griffin had called him to get at least

three names to be on this committee. He had talked with Quinton Vibbert and Jennings Garman and both agreed to serve. The clerk said Lawrence Stiffey had requested numerous times that he be considered. Mayor Gilley said he would present the names to Judge Griffin for consideration.

d. The clerk if the commission would have a December meeting. They all agreed that if something pressing came up, they would, otherwise they would not.

e. Mayor Gilley said he felt the clerk had put in considerable overtime and made numerous trips to Bowling Green for the city business and wondered the feelings of the commission on reimbursing her for this effort. Comm. Barrow presented a motion to give the clerk \$100.00 seconded by Comm. Smith. Roll call and vote - Smith yes, Gilley yes, Barrow yes.

f. Two way radio for the police chief

Comm. Barrow, in charge of the police dept., said Sheriff Gaines had requested our police chief have a two-way radio on his possession for his safety. The clerk had checked for prices, and they would run in the area of \$560.00 with charger base. Comm. Barrow presented a motion to purchase this radio for Chief bybee, seconded by Comm. Smith. Roll call and vote - Barrow yes, Gilley yes, Smith yes.

g. Building permit-Smiths Grove Church of Christ

The Smiths Grove Church of Christ had applied for a building permit to add a 20x30 addition to the church to be used for Sunday school rooms. Comm. Smith presented a motion to allow this permit to be issued, seconded by Comm. Barrow. Roll call and vote - Smith yes, Gilley yes, Barrow yes.

With no further business to be presented a motion to adjourn was heard.
